

On 11 November, the trainers were able to take delivery of the AC service unit. Although the device had already started its journey at the end of August, the transport and customs clearance costs were limited to 300 euros by transporting it in a private shared container.

We are currently planning to organise an online training course for the trainers in spring 2025, with Björn Schleifer from WOW Würth Online World and Wolfgang.

The 2 trainers employed at the university training centre in Kumasi are still working there, they would like to do more training and repairs. Discussions are currently taking place to advertise more effectively so that more can be done there.

As none of our trainers, apart from our three master trainers, have organised a course since the spring, we have done some research. Although they now have the Snooper+ diagnostic interfaces from WOW Würth Online World, they now lack a laptop to read out and process the data from the vehicles. Two have broken down and the others wanted to buy one, but this was no longer possible due to the poor economic situation. A second-hand laptop currently costs €250 in Ghana. An appeal for donations for purchasing laptops in Ghana was sent to the supporters of Ghatronic in December. Many thanks to the donors. In addition, Wolfgang will not be flying to Ghana in the spring; online seminars will take place. He will also donate the saved flight, visa and accommodation costs as well as the compensation costs for 3,194 kg CO₂ totalling 1250 euros.

The economic situation in Ghana is difficult, inflation is high, and a tougher anti-LGBTIQ+ law is in the process of being passed. The law has been condemned by the United Nations. There are fears that the World Bank will cancel fundings to Ghana.

Elections were held on 7 December, which were won by the opposition party until then, the NDC; the new president is now John Mahama. The elections were peaceful. The inauguration of John Mahama will take place on 7 January.
